The Miner Board of Alderman met for its regular monthly meeting on March 20, 2012 at 5:30 p.m. The meeting was posted in the foyer of city hall and sent to the Standard-Democrat newspaper.

A. ACCEPTING IBDS ON PUBLIC WORKS TRUCK

Mayor Pro-Tem Deloris Smith announced that we had received two (2) bids on the new ¾ 4-wheel drive pickup that was put out for bid by the public works department. The first bid was from Putnam Chevrolet from California, MO in the amount of \$21200.00 with a 45 to 60 day lead time. The second bid was from Autry Morlan of Miner, MO in the amount of \$25034.00 with a lot of discussion it was difficult to compare to differences in the two trucks with an “apples to apples comparison” a motion was made by Charles McLemore to purchase the one from Autry Morlan since they are local and the motion was seconded by Peggy Holman. A roll call vote followed with all ayes with Rickie Hampton being absent.


Alderman Charles McLemore asked if we were going to do anything to update the voter registration list; because he noticed that there are several names on the list when he knows those people have moved out of the city. Attorney Joseph Fuchs informed
